Business of the meeting of the Parish Council

1. Apologies for absence

2. To review the minutes of the meeting held on 2nd February 2021

Cllr L. Fowler proposed to accept the minutes of the meeting as an accurate record once they had been amended to show that Chrissy Price is going to plant up the stone troughs in the Village in memory of her father in law, Cllr L. Hutchinson is going to use the In Bloom grant to plant up the rest of the planters in the Village. Cllr M. Blackburn seconded and all were in favour and the minutes were approved.

3. To consider the Clerks report

a) Ongoing items:

– The Clerk confirmed that all items were ongoing with nothing further to update on.

b) Environment Agency (EA) and Flooding: Suttons Hill has been cleaned but it needs a CCTV to be carried out. The Councillors are going to keep an eye on the issue.

4. To be updated on the financial report:

a) To consider the monthly report: The Parish Council discussed the report and all payments were approved.

The Parish Councillors discussed the hedge trimming on the PROW between Low Burgage and Marsh Lane, the Clerk is to ask the Handyman to remove the trimmings that have been left behind.

5. To consider the following planning applications:

a) PA/2021/207: Listed building consent to replace roof and install roof windows to rear elevation at The Hollies, 23 Silver Street, Winteringham, DN15 9ND: No negative comments were made.

b) PA/2020/1477: Planning permission to site a shipping container at Village Hall, Frost Close, Winteringham, DN15 9PL: The Parish Council are unable to make comments on this application.

c) EPC2-21 Design Code Consultation: No comments were made.

- d) Any other applications from the date of this agenda being sent out: None were received.
- e) Neighbourhood Plan: Cllr M. Blackburn is to finalise a questionnaire to go in the next edition of the Newsletter. The questionnaire is to gauge residents responses to see if a Neighbourhood Plan is needed.

6. To report any new highways matters:

- a) Road Surfaces: The roads are in a bad state all over the Parish. They are to be monitored and reported to North Lincolnshire Council as needed.
- b) Street Lights: A street light is out on Frost Close.
- c) Pavements: The path on Jubilee Gardens is uneven and could be a trip hazard. Mark Thornborough is to look into it.
- d) Parish Footpaths: The Parish Council discussed the quotes for the cutting of the PROW, it was agreed to use Grove Groundwork.
- e) Playing field and ASFW: The Clerk had been contacted by a parent about an accident involving the gate at the Play Park. The Handyman has been asked to look into it. The Clerk is to get quotes for the replacement of the wire fence at the edge of the Play Park.
There is an ongoing issue with glass on the floor near the teen shelter.
- f) West End Bank: No further comments were made.
- g) Verge Cutting Grass Quotes: The Parish Council discussed the quotes and chose to use Grove Groundwork.

7. To hear the reports from representatives:

- a) NHW: Thanks were given to the distributors of the Fraud Scam leaflets. Thanks were given to Cllr M. Blackburn for updating the website.
- b) Village Hall: It was suggested by the Village Hall Committee that a small noticeboard could be put up on the Village Hall to advertise events being held in the hall. The Parish Council were positive about the suggestion.
- c) Newsletter: Suggestions were made regarding items that could be put in the newsletter. It was agreed that the Newsletter could be produced for distribution at the end of April.

8. To review any correspondence

No other correspondence has been received.

9. Any other business

- a) Snowman Competition: Everyone was really happy with the competition.

The Parish Council agreed to have a multi purpose bin installed by the passing place on Marsh lane.

A resident had asked for a yellow grit bin to be placed on Meggitt Lane near the Church, the Clerk confirmed that she had submitted an application for the grit bin.
