

WINTERINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL

5TH JUNE 2018

Matters raised by the residents' present

Martin Bell informed the council that the Meggit Lane street sign attached to the Church wall is rotten. He asked if the current sign could be kept and that new posts are installed.

The All Saints Church currently use a grass cutter to maintain the grass. Martin Bell asked if a new grass cutter could be bought by the Parish Council as the current one is not going to last much longer. The Council asked for further information so that the cost can be clarified and Cllr R. Ogg will see if there is any provision within the Community Grant. It was also agreed that the Clerk should write to the Diocese in Lincoln requesting that they offer financial assistance to the All Saints Church. Cllr P. Hatton suggested that they try The Lions for funding.

Gordon Kell came from the Humber Nature Partnership to discuss the work that they carry out. The Parish Council discussed the reeds down at the Humber Yawl Club, this is something that The Humber Nature Partnership may be able to assist with and the Clerk is to write to the Yawl Club highlighting this information.

BUSINESS OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

1. To hear the Apologies for Absence

2. To discuss the Parish Councillor Vacancy

The Parish Council interviewed the candidates prior to the meeting and It was decided to Co-Opt Debbie Fagan onto the parish council, all were in favour.

3. To review minutes of the meeting held on 1st May 2018

Cllr W. Foord proposed that the minutes were an accurate record of the meeting, Cllr K. Ashberry seconded and all were in favour. Cllr K. Ashberry proposed that the minutes of the Annual Parish Assembly were an accurate record of the meeting, Cllr P. Hatton seconded and all were in favour.

4. To hear the report from North Lincs Councillors

Cllrs R. Ogg and E. Marper gave the following report:

- From 7th-14th June works are due to be carried out outside 4-6 Market Hill with two way signals being in place.
- There was nothing to report regarding the proposed work to be carried out from Silver street to A1077, the work on the wall at the Shop Corner, signage for the Haven Bridge and the 30mph sign on Winterton Road.
- The refused planning permission for the building of new houses at 3-5 West End has gone to the Inspector and NLC are awaiting a response.
- Cllr C. Price asked if the bank at Shop Corner could be sprayed as it is looking very weedy. It was agreed that further photos of the problems regarding the Bank at the Shop corner are to be sent to Rob Waltham.
- The council were informed that a query had been raised at the NLC NATS meeting regarding a property in Winteringham. The query was around the legality of the health and safety of the property and the relevant agencies have inspected it and found it to be in good condition with some works needed.

5. To hear an update on the ongoing Recreation Grant and play area refurbishment

Cllr Debbie Fagan confirmed that the lining is now complete on the All-Weather Pitch and that the paperwork has been sent to NLC. Del John has advised that triangle pieces are to be welded to the gate as a retainer. Some photos have been taken and Fletchers are to be approached for a price for the proposed retainer. All councillors agreed that it is to be done ASAP. NLC have provided a sign to be displayed on the fence of the play area, the Clerk is to pass this sign to Cllr B. Bateson.

The Parish Council discussed the teen shelter, the response from residents from the play area questionnaire is that they want the teen shelter removed. Cllr K Ashberry proposed that the teen shelter is to be demolished, Cllr W. Foord seconded and all agreed. Cllr D. Fagan is to look at the options and report back at the next Parish Council meeting.

6. To consider the Clerks report

The Clerk gave the following report:

- The Telephone Box is now owned by the Parish Council, the Clerk is to obtain quotes for its refurbishment.
- Cllr K. Ashberry has reminded Les Ward to take the Play Area sign down.
- It was confirmed that Laurel Cottage is not in the conservation area.
- The Parish Council agreed that an aerator was no longer needed for the Playing Field.
- Cllr B. Bateson and the Handyman are to look at the bins in the Play Area and to repair the loose breeze block that has come out of the wall at the Play Area.
- The Clerk circulated the proposed speed signs for outside the school and the Parish Council agreed that they were happy with their placement.

- A meeting is to be set up with the Handyman regarding tasks that are not completed, it was agreed that Cllr D. Fagan is to oversee the handymans work.

7. To be updated on the Financial report

- a) The council approved the monthly financial report including payments. It was confirmed that the Parish Council received £100.00 from the Mighty Burgage Band for the Nature Garden, a letter of thanks is to go out.
- b) The Parish Council approved Section One of the Annual General Return.
- c) The Parish Council considered and approved Section Two of the Annual General Return.

8. To be updated regarding the progress on the NLC Grant conditions

Cllr C. Price informed the Council that there was one more meeting on the 8th June 2018 regarding the Emergency Plan. There needs to be two emergency boxes made up that will cost £61.64 each, the Council confirmed that they are happy to pay the costs. Cllr D. Fagan gave thanks for the work carried out on the plan.

9. To consider the following Planning Applications:

- a) Retrospective Planning application PA/2017/1470: The Clerk informed the Council that an appropriate ageing method should have been applied to the back of the wall and is due to be inspected this week, the planning officer will inform the Council of the outcome. The Council asked if they could look at the proposed method before it is approved.
- b) Approved Planning application PA/2018/609: to erect an extension to an existing agricultural building to house livestock at Parsons Cross, 39 Cliff Road, Winteringham, DN15 9NQ. No comments or objections were raised.
- c) Planning application PA/2018/927: No comments or objections were raised.

10. To hear the latest GDPR report

The Clerk informed the Council about the changes that have taken place regarding the website and GDPR. There are still items outstanding and the work is ongoing. Cllr S. Foston reminded the Clerk that councillors need to give consent for their information to be on the website.

11. To hear the latest Transparency Code report

Once the finances are back from the auditors the paperwork will be displayed on the website. Cllr S. Foston also confirmed that the Clerk would need some training on running the website.

12. To be updated on the AWS Pitch Report

Nothing new to report.

13. To report any new Highways matters

- a) Potholes: There is large pothole in the middle of the road where the bus stop is on High Burgage and that there are many potholes on Cliff Road. The High Burgage street sign is rotting and the council requested that the handyman look at it.
- b) Street lights: Nothing to report.
- c) Pavements/Footpaths: The surface is coming off along Cliff Road. Cllr S. Foston confirmed that the Memorial Bench is now in and thanks was given as it is a welcome addition to the Village.
- d) Parish footpaths: Nothing to report from the committee meeting, items are still ongoing.
- e) Playing Field: It was confirmed that only one Tennis net is to be put up. Sport England have been in touch regarding updating the details on their website. Meeting was suspended 21.07pm to allow a resident to speak about using online services to advertise the sports facilities, meeting resumed at 21:10pm. The Council decided not to advertise on Sport Englands website, Cllr D. Fagan proposed, Cllr K. Ashberry seconded and all were in favour. Cllr P. Hatton told the Council that there is a tree on the Back Lane triangle that has a low hanging branch, Cllr B. Bateson is to have a look and trim it.

14. To hear the Reports from representatives

- a) NATS: Nothing to report
- b) NHW: There were 23 bags of rubbish collected from the last litter pick and 135 bags of rubbish collected from March. There is the Community Safety Day on Saturday 9th June in the Village Hall, there will be an opportunity to sign up Police Community Alerts.
- c) Village Hall: The committee now have a Treasurer but are still looking for a Secretary. The upcoming events were confirmed.
- d) Festival: It was confirmed that all contracts are now signed and the program has been finalised.
- e) Nature Garden: The planters are going to be put up this week. John Wilkinson wants to stop cutting Jubilee Gardens, Ian Parkinson is currently cutting it but the Council will need to take someone on to do it. It was proposed whether it could be Included in the Handyman's hours. Cllr C. Price confirmed that the Community Payback Team are to come and repaint the wall memorial and the Handyman's strimmer is now fixed.

- f) Newsletter: Cllr K. Ashberry to pass over the Newsletter ASAP. The Clerk is to send out letters to advertisers with a submission date for articles of the 30th June 2018.

15. To review any correspondence

Winterton 2022 have been in touch to ask if the Parish Council will be able to advertise the upcoming Toads and Moths trail. The Council confirmed that they would be happy to advertise the event.

16. To discuss any other business

There has been significant movement regarding a wall on a property on West End. The Council were concerned that it would be a hazard to pedestrians and the Clerk is to write a letter.

17. To give any comments to the Chair

No comments were made.
