

## **Winteringham Parish Council**

**6<sup>th</sup> November 2018**

### **Matters raised by the residents' present**

The Flying Flamingos Lifestyle group were presented with certificates from the Parish Council for their work in the Nature Garden and around the Village. Their parents were also thanked for their support.

Mike Pinnock informed the Parish Council that he has set up a group to defend, restore and improve the natural environment around the Village, he detailed some of the plans and projects that the group are going to be carrying out. The Group meets every three months.

Del John asked when the LED street lights on Cliff Road will be put in. Cllr R. Ogg confirmed that they will be carried out last and informed Del John of the timing.

A resident raised concerns about planning application PA/2018/2047. Cllr C. Price confirmed that the time to submit comments to NLC Planning department has been delayed until 6<sup>th</sup> December. Cllr C. Price is looking for residents to let her know their thoughts on the application so that an action plan can be put in place. The Parish Council will inform residents what type of objections can be made against the application.

### **Business of the Parish Council meeting**

1. To hear the apologies for absence

2. Parish Councillor Vacancy

Cllr C. Price informed the Parish Council that there were four applicants for the position and all four candidates were excellent. Stuart Moody scored the highest through interview and was recommended to be co-opted onto the Parish Council. All were in agreement and he was co-opted on to the Parish Council. The Chair discussed the upcoming election next year.

3. To review the minutes of the meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> October

Cllr L. Kirkby proposed to accept the minutes as a true record, Cllr S. Foston seconded and all were in favour.

4. Report from North Lincs Councillors

Cllr R. Ogg gave the following report:

- An engineer has looked at the Haven Bridge and it could be repointed. He is due to come and have another look on Friday.
- The Parish Council will need to let Cllr R. Ogg know if they want to join the Parish Verge Cutting Scheme by 3pm Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> November.
- Waterside and Marsh Lane are due to be resurfaced in financial year 2019-2020, Cllr K. Ashberry asked if Booth Knocking could be done at the same time.
- The CEMEX speed limit application is still awaiting a decision.

- The proposed footpath from Winteringham to South Ferriby is still ongoing. Cllr R. Ogg confirmed that the best way for residents to get involved is to speak to the landowners about granting permission for the footpath to be instated.

#### 5. To Consider the Clerks Report

- a) The Clerk gave an update on the following items:
  - The retainer had been fitted to the gate on the AWS Pitch.
  - The Parish Council discussed the grass verge cutting scheme and voted to sign up to the scheme. All were in favour except for one against.
  - The Parish Council discussed the verge cutting quotes and decided to use Grove Groundwork, all were in favour except for one abstention.
  - It was confirmed that the changes to the Teen shelter were due to take place in December.
- b) GDPR Policies: The Parish Council voted to accept the circulated GDPR policies and procedures.
- c) Asset Disposal Procedure: The Parish Council voted to accept the Asset Disposal Procedure that the Clerk had circulated. The Clerk is to update the Asset Register once the changes have been made to the teen shelter.

#### 6. To be updated on the Financial Report

- a) The Parish Council were presented with the financial report. All payments were approved.
- b) The Parish Council were presented with the spending from April up to the end of September, no comments were made.
- c) The Parish Council were presented with the draft budget for the next financial year. Amendments were suggested and the precept will be approved next month.

#### 7. Planning Applications

- a) PA/2018/2047: The Parish Council discussed the application and comments on it was deferred until the next Parish Council meeting. This is to allow time for residents to voice their views on the matter. In the meantime the Parish Council is to approach an independent planning advisor for assistance in the matter.
- b) PA/2018/40: No further comments were made, the Clerk is to reiterate the original objections that were made.
- c) PA/2018/1939: There was significant concern that property no.27 would fall into disrepair and that the flooding come down from Ferry Lane had not been taken into account. There was also concern that it was a tandem build which is against NLC policy.
- d) PA/2018/1991: Cllr I. Dowson declared an interest in this item. The Parish Council made no comment or objection to the application.
- e) Any other planning applications from the date of the Agenda being sent out: None had been received.

#### 8. Meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> December

There is going to be a meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> December at the Village Hall at 7pm to discuss the ongoing flooding issues around the Village. NLC drainage team, Anglian Water and the Environment Agency will be attending. It was agreed after this meeting, at 8pm, another

meeting would be held to discuss planning application PA/2018/2047 with residents. Flyers are to be printed and sent out about the meetings on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December.

#### 9. Handyman Vacancy

The Parish Council are still awaiting references but are hoping to interview and appoint by the end of the month.

#### 10. North Lincolnshire Statement of Community Involvement 2018

Cllr C. Price discussed the opportunity to do a Neighbourhood Plan. It was voiced that residents not on the Parish Council might like to get involved. Cllr C. Price is to lead this project due to a lack of support from other councillors.

#### 11. Highways Matters

- a) Road Surfaces: Several items were mentioned and the Clerk is to raise these with NLC.
- b) Street lights: A street light outside the school is not working.
- c) Pavements: It has been noted that weeds are coming up through the slurry sealed pavements.
- d) Parish Footpaths: Nigel Dowse has asked if he can work with the Parish Paths Committee. There were no objections and a meeting will be arranged.
- e) Playing Field and AWS Pitch Report: Once the Handyman has been appointed the Park needs strimming and weeding ASAP. Cllr. K Ashberry asked that if spring bulbs are going to be planted then it might be better further out of the Village. This is because the verges that they are planted on cannot be cut for a couple of months after flowering and this makes the Village look shabby. The Parish Council discussed the tree trimming quote for the vandalised trees on the playing field. The Clerk is to obtain further quotes.

#### 12. Reports

- a) Transparency Code: Nothing to report.
- b) NATS: The next meeting is tomorrow so there was nothing to report.
- c) NHW: Safer Neighbourhoods are holding a drop-in session on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> November for residents. Cllr C. Price asked if the item of Travellers having access to the Playing Field could be put on the Agenda for next month. The Snow Warden role and help was discussed. A piece is to be put in the Newsletter asking for volunteers to help with the Snow Warden Scheme.
- d) Village Hall: There are several upcoming items and Cllr W. Foord confirmed that a new boiler had been fitted.
- e) Festival: The Committee have decided that it might work better to have three separate smaller events throughout the year instead of one larger annual event. Residents are being asked what type of events they would like or if they would still like the Festival to continue to run.
- f) Nature Garden: There was nothing to report.
- g) Newsletter: Several suggestions of changes to the administration of the Newsletter were presented to the Parish Council. The councillors felt that the suggestions were good and a meeting is to be arranged to discuss the finer details.

#### 13. Correspondence

Nothing to report.

14. Any other business

- Cllr L. Kirkby will look into the Winter planting, he has been approved a budget of £50.00.
- Cllr C. Price confirmed that she will be attending the ERNLLCA yearly conference.
- A letter is to be sent to Colin McGurran congratulating him on his Michelin Star.
- It was suggested that the telephone box be turned into a planter. The Clerk is to ask NLC planning if this is possible.

15. Key messages

It was agreed that the planning meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> December and the co-option of Stuart Moody were the key messages to be highlighted to the Parish.
